Chairman Schank called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. at Red's Old 395 Gill, 1055 S. Carson St., Carson City, Nevada. The CWSD/Alpine County Joint Powers Board was convened. Roll call was taken and a quorum was determined to be present. The Pledge of Allegiance was lead by Director Johnson.

<u>Item #5 - Approval of Agenda.</u> Director Jardine made the motion to approve the agenda. The motion was seconded by Director Abowd and unanimously approved by the Board.

Item #6 - Approval of November 20, 2013, Board Meeting Minutes. Director Rawson made the motion to approve the November 20, 2013, Board meeting minutes, which were seconded by Director Penzel and unanimously approved by the Board, with Directors Erquiaga, Jardine, Ricci, and Stodieck abstaining as not being present at that meeting.

Item #11 - Discussion for possible action regarding approval to apply for the Nevada Division of State Parks (NDSP) Motorized Recreational Trails grant.

Director Fierro requested that Item #8 be pulled from the Consent Agenda for discussion. Director McKenna made the motion to approve the consent agenda items #9-11. The motion was seconded by Director Frensdorff and unanimously approved by the Board. There was no public comment.

END OF CONSENT AGENDA

Item #8 - Approval of Treasurer's Report for November 2013. Director Fierro noted that there were several bank certificates of deposit (CDs) shown as investments in the Treasurer's Report. He requested that staff include information in the report to indicate the interest rates and terms of the CDs and cautioned that staff needed to be cautious about tying up large amounts of cash in CDs for too long a term. Mr. James commented that staff considers that very carefully as investments are made. We diversify our investments because the State Local Government Investment Pool, our primary investment vehicle, is offering such a low rate right now (0.02%). We can maximize our income from interest by investing the maximum \$250,000 FDIC-insured amount in bank CDs that offer significantly higher short-term interest rates. Mr. James offered to talk more with Director Fierro after the Board meeting if he would like.

Director Fierro made the motion to approve the November 2013 Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Director Johnson and unanimously approved by the Board.

Item #12 - Discussion for possible action regarding approval of the 2014 candidate for the Andy Aldax Carson River Watershed Award. Director Schank explained that this year there were three nominations of candidates for the Andy Aldax Award: Carson City Open Space Program, Judy Wickwire of Alpine County, and Mahmood "Moody" and Genie Azad. The Administrative Committee met to review the nominations and expressed the desire to see an individual receive the award over a group/business. With that in mind, and since the Committee found great merit for receiving the award in both of the other nominations, the Committee chose to forward the nominations of both Judy Wickwire and Moody and Genie Azad to the full Board for a selection.

To begin the discussion of the two nominees, Director Rawson explained that she had done some extra research on Judy Wickwire for this nomination. A list of her notes are on page 49 of the Board package. Additionally, Director Rawson noted that Ms. Wickwire wakes up every day looking for what she can volunteer towards that day and "lives and breathes" volunteering. As indicated by the list, her volunteer accomplishments are vast and varied. Director Jardine mentioned that Judy is native to the Alpine County area, and he has know her all her life. She runs a fly fishing school and has done much in a volunteer capacity for both the private sector and the environment. Director. Rawson added that most people in the community do not know the immensity of Ms. Wickwire's contributions because she is not braggadocios, but Ms. Wickwire had mentioned that win or lose, just being nominated for the Andy Aldax Award "made her day."

Director Schank spoke about his knowledge of Moody and Genie Azad's individual and collective contributions for the benefit of the watershed. Director Lynn noted that Moody's work at Lake Tahoe, especially in the area of establishing Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs), was foundational to much of the work toward an improved environment in many watersheds. Mr. James pointed out that Mr. Azad passed away last year and Genie, who worked for CWSD for nine years, is getting ready to leave the area. His nomination of the couple was in hoping to acknowledge their contributions before neither of them are available to receive the award.

Director McKenna suggested giving the award to each of the nominees and noted that he feels that recognizing both nominees doesn't diminish the award. Director Johnson stated that he prefers to stick with one award recipient per year. He noted that the Azads contributed both through their work environment and as volunteers. Director Fierro expressed his opinion that having more than one recipient per year takes away from the honor of receiving the award. He suggested, as he had in the Administrative Committee meeting, that an additional system of recognition through certificates, etc., be established in order to honor more people's service each year.

After further discussion, Director Penzel made the motion to grant the 2014 Andy Aldax Award to both Judy Wickwire and Moody and Genie Azad. The motion was seconded by Director Abowd. In trying to reconcile the differing viewpoints, the suggestion was made that the Azads receive the award this year since Genie is leaving the area and Ms. Wickwire receive the award next year. Director Penzel commented that this is a big watershed and different tasks were done by each nominee, so granting the award to both shouldn't take away from the value of the award. Mr. James noted that the most important thing is to recognize the achievements for the benefit of the watershed. Since there was a motion and second on the floor, the Board voted unanimously to grant the award to both parties for 2014.

Item #13 - Discussion and possible action regarding an update on the dam work completed at Lost Lakes. Mr. James explained that Debbie Neddenriep of the CWSD staff had been primary in supervising the recent work at Lost Lakes and turned the floor over to her. Ms. Neddenriep reported with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation about the process of outlet clearing over the past couple of months. She expressed her appreciation for the assistance of Shane Fryer of the Alpine Watershed Group in diving into the reservoir to clear sediment from the dam outlet structure, for advice and assistance from Directors Stodieck and Jardine, for the directions and use of Director McKenna's come-along, and for the field crew.

Mr. James reported that he had received a phone call from the California Division of Safety of Dams in response to our letter requesting the reduction of dam inspection fees. They noted that

they do not have the regulatory authority to reduce our dam fees. The change would require legislative action. Mr. James told them that we were aware of this and that CWSD's Board members are planning to contact their local legislators. Mr. James assured them that CWSD wants to work cooperatively with their staff as well as with legislators on this issue. Directors Rawson and Jardine will address this issue to state legislators on behalf of Alpine County and CWSD.

No action was required on this item; receive and file.

Item #14 - Discussion for possible action regarding an update on Nevada Department of Agriculture (NDA) Hearing on Mayweed Chamomile. Brenda Hunt, CWSD Watershed Coordinator, gave a brief background on the issue. The Pacific Weed Growers petitioned for removal of Mayweed Chamomile from Nevada's invasive weed seed list. It is on both Nevada's invasive weed seed and invasive weed lists. Nevada interests are opposed to removing an invasive weed seed from the seed list since it would grow into the invasive weed and be a burden to Nevada to treat.

Ms. Hunt noted that the Nevada Department of Agriculture hearing on the issue was held on 12/11/13, and that she, Mr. James, and Ms. Walker all attended in opposition on behalf of CWSD. The Carson River Watershed and other northern Nevada watersheds were also well represented in opposition. A decision is expected to be made by the Department of Agriculture on 12/20/13, and Ms. Hunt will pass along any information she receives.

No action was taken on this item; receive and file.

Item #15 - Discussion for possible action regarding pursuit of a US Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) WaterSMART grant to fund water conservation projects as recommended in the Comprehensive Regional Water System Plan. Mr. James explained that the Regional Water Conservation Plan requires us to look for grants for water conservation. There are residents who are willing to remove some of the turf from their property but find that re-landscaping is too expensive. The goal of this grant is to provide some funding to home owners to remove turf and re-landscape in such a way that will reduce water demands. The match would come from the homeowner Residents in all Carson River watershed counties would be eligible to receive this grant funding, including Storey and Alpine Counties. The total grant amount will be approximately \$250,000. Some of the grant would go toward larger projects and some to smaller ones. The grant will be marketed through landscapers, and the projects will include the use of residential Best Management Practices (BMPs).

Director Penzel asked if the landscaping plan is for xeroscaping. Mr. James responded that they would not necessarily be xeroscaping but would be designed to produce a pleasing result for the community.

Director Abowd asked how long CWSD would be accountable for the residents maintaining the new landscaping. Mr. James mentioned that our goal is to set up the program such that if the project meets our criteria we will not need to do any long term monitoring. Mr. James responded that this is a one-year grant with funds coming next summer. Staff has talked with the USBR grant administrator who said our match is good. Director Fierro confirmed that no CWSD funds would be required, only grant funds.

Director Stodieck asked if the grant could be used for agricultural improvements that would conserve water, like laser leveling. Mr. James responded that he would look into it and get back to the Board with an answer to that question.

Director Rawson made the motion to approve writing and submission of USBR WaterSMART grant by staff to fund water conservation projects in the Carson River Watershed. Director Stodieck seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by the Board.

Item #16 - Staff Reports

General Manager - Mr. James reported: 1) He has been talking with Douglas County water purveyors regarding cooperation among purveyors. Further discussion is on hold until the Town of Minden conducts its strategic planning session. 2) The USGS contacted Mr. James regarding modifying their nitrogen sampling in Lyon County. What the USGS is proposing will provide Lyon County with additional information at no additional cost to CWSD. Mr. James referred the Board members to the handout. 3) Mr. James handed out an article talking about EPA's goal number 4 for 2014. EPA's focus will be on stormwater and defining "Waters of the US." 4) Mr. James drew the Board's attention to a news article which was handed out about the outcome of the "takings" lawsuit. Basically, residents claimed that a change in the FEMA floodplain maps was a taking of their property, but the Court concluded that the modified floodplain was not a taking.

Legal – Mr. Benesch reported on a Court decision in White Pine County. The State Engineer's office was required to recalculate all water available in all the counties.

Correspondence – As in the Board package and handed out.

Item #18 - Directors' Reports

Director Rawson reported that she had enjoyed interviewing Judy Wickwire.

Director Schank commented that he appreciates all that the CWSD staff does to make the organization run smoothly and all of the Directors who make this a good participatory Board.

Directors Abowd, Fierro, Frensdorff, Johnson, Osborne, Penzel, Erquiaga, Jardine, Ricci, Stodieck, and Lynn had nothing specific to report by joined the others in thanking the staff for a fun Christmas celebration and wishing everyone a Merry Christmas.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Director Johnson made the motion to adjourn and the meeting was adjourned at 8:09 p.m.

DISCUSSION: The Andy Aldax Award for Exemplary Service in Conservation and Protection of the Carson River Watershed was created in 2007 to honor CWSD Director Andy Aldax who has served on this Board since its creation in 1959. The criteria for consideration of this award is that the nominee:

- 1. has demonstrated a commitment to Carson River Watershed conservation activities for 10 years or more;
- 2. has produced accomplishments toward the goals outlined in the Carson River Watershed Vision Statement; and
- 3. can be a landowner, community member, or employee of a federal, state or local entity.

At the December 2013 Board meeting the Board voted unanimously to give the Andy Aldax Award for 2014 to both Judy Wickwire of Alpine County and Moody and Genie Azad. Judy Wickwire was nominated by Sarah Green of the Alpine Watershed Group and the Azads were nominated by Ed James.

Judy Wickwire has played a crucial role in watershed stewardship and natural resource protection in the Carson River watershed for many years. She has lead volunteer willow planting projects on an annual basis, done water quality monitoring, and served as Hope Valley Steward, Creek Day team leader, and Snapshot Day educator. She was the first woman governor for Cal Trout and served as Vice President of the Alpine County Fish and Game Commission. Judy was a working member of the team that helped establish the Hope Valley Access Area and maintains the Access sign for the California Department of Fish and Game (DFG). She is the owner of Horse Feathers Fly Fishing School based at Sorensen's Resort in Hope Valley which has been in operation for 44 years. She is a founding member of High Sierra Flycasters organization and the Trout in the Classroom Program in Alpine County schools. She also does photo documenting for the Alpine Watershed Group, Friends of Hope Valley, and the Historical Society.

To their credit Mahmood "Moody" and Genie Azad have provided their professionalism and skills in the protection, enhancement, and health of the Carson River Watershed. Moody, who passed away in 2012, had over 25 years of experience working in the water resource field with most of his career in the Carson River Watershed. During that time he worked for the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP), Carson City, Douglas County, City of Reno, Nevada Tahoe Conservation District, and several

consulting firms. He worked on stormwater issues, water quality studies, and flood projects in Carson City, as well as river restoration projects. His fine interpersonal skills allowed him to communicate with people on every level while sharing both his knowledge and enthusiasm for environmental protection. He was best recognized for his work on total maximum daily load (TMDL) research. He was also an inventor and avid fisherman.

Genie Azad has worked on environmental issues in Nevada and northern California since 1997. CWSD gained from her knowledge and enthusiasm as Watershed Coordinator from 2002-2011. Genie successfully coordinated the Carson River Coalition (CRC) process, helped develop the Carson River Regional Floodplain Management Plan and the Carson River Stewardship Plan, and managed grants for many projects and studies. Since her retirement from CWSD, Genie has continued to stay involved in the watershed by assisting CWSD with FEMA programs and serving on the River Wrangler's Board.

Judy Wickwire and Genie Azad will be present to receive the award at the January meeting.

CWSD will also continue to coordinate with NDOT as they work to resolve many erosion problems created by Highway 50. CWSD and members of the CRC will continue to monitor any water quality issues and organize activities in the Clear Creek drainage as needed.

Introduction:

This final report outlines the accomplishments associated with the NDEP grant funding from the above contract. The report describes the project and summarizes the activities, tasks and the deliverables required to ensure the goals and objectives of the grant were achieved. The primary goal of the Clear Creek Watershed Council is to educate stakeholders and property owners about reducing impacts of NPS pollution to Clear Creek and ultimately the Carson River.

Outreach priorities include impacts of stormwater runoff and BMP education for property owners. To achieve this, CWSD retained a Coordinator to organize educational activities and when needed, facilitate coordination of erosion control projects implemented by USFS, NDOT and CVCD. Margie Evans was the Coordinator until she resigned 7/31/2011. Brenda Hunt took over the duties when she was hired as the Carson River Watershed Coordinator on 8/1/2011. Subsequently, Nikki Florio was hired as the Clear Creek Coordinator, in July 2012. Nikki resigned 1/10/2013.

After Nikki Florio resigned, a Clear Creek Leadership meeting was held to discuss phasing out the grant contract at the end of 2013. CWSD did not reapply to continue 319 grant funding for the Clear Creek Education Program beyond 2013. Citizen involvement in the Clear Creek Watershed Council has not been increasing over time and NDEP determined that the grant monies may be better utilized elsewhere. During the January 24, 2013 Leadership meeting, it was decided the CWSD would focus on accomplishing specific tasks which included developing additional interpretive signage and maintaining Snapshot Day involvement.

Summary of Activities, tasks and deliverables:

Task 1: Prepare quarterly newsletters, quarterly reports and invoices.

- All quarterly reports and invoices were submitted to NDEP in a timely manner.
- The Clear Creek newsletter was prepared and sent out twice during this grant agreement: Spring and Summer 2011. Distribution of a separate Clear Creek Newsletter was suspended after Margie Evans resigned. The CWSD agreed to include Clear Creek issues in the Carson River Watershed newsletter when appropriate.
- The Flow newsletter was prepared and sent out 9 times to Clear Creek stakeholders during this grant agreement: September 2011, quarterly in 2012 and 2013.

Task 2: Organize council meetings (Leadership every other month (except December), and full Council meetings 3 times a year (Spring/Summer BBQ/Fall) and record minutes.

In other weed matters, several Carson River Coalition members and others have written letters to Robert Little of NDA expressing concerns with the management of weeds by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in Lyon, Carson City and Douglas Counties (see attached letters). CWSD has written a letter to Mr. Little supporting these entities' concerns (attached).

Nevada Dept. of Agriculture takes no action on Mayweed chamomile regulation change

SPARKS, Nev. -- The Nevada Department of Agriculture today announced that it will not act on a regulation that sought to reduce restrictions in Nevada on Mayweed chamomile, a noxious weed.

Nevada was approached by the Pacific Northwest Seed Growers Association to remove Mayweed chamomile from Nevada's prohibited seed list. The Department held a workshop in May to hear the pros and cons of the issue.

Seed growers from the Northwest were in support of removing the weed from Nevada's prohibited seed list, but land managers in the state expressed opposition.

Department Director Jim Barbee issued the following statement:

"After careful consideration of all sides, we have decided to not act on this regulation, which would have removed Mayweed chamomile from Nevada's prohibited seed list. The plant spreads quickly and may be damaging to humans and livestock.

"We are aware of the impact our decisions have on interstate commerce – however, we believe this is the most appropriate course of action at this time. Noxious and invasive plants in Nevada have severe negative impacts on our agriculture industry, wildlife, natural resources and recreational opportunities.



Dear Mr. Little,

I am writing this letter regarding the noxious weed problem's on the Bureau of Land Management's property in the Dayton Valley area. At the Dayton Valley Conservation District we are working hard to eradicate weeds in the Dayton Valley along the Carson River Corridor and its tributaries. We are supported by many landowners, agricultural producers and business entities.

Three years ago we assisted the BLM in the treatment of Perennial Pepperweed and other invasive weeds in multiple areas on BLM property which include; Rattlesnake Spring, Erastor Spring, Fiddlers Green Hazlet Spring, Wild rose Spring and Eldorado Canyon. Additional areas that we treated were American Ravine and portions of American Flats, in Lyon and Storey County. I have not observed in the past three years where any treatment has been completed by the BLM and I am very concerned that those areas are already seeing increases in invasive plant populations. Some of the invasive species mapped in the BLM areas are Perennial Pepperweed, Hoary Cress, Tamarisk, Canada Thistle and Bull Thistle.

This was a significant effort to try and minimize the impacts of the plant's making their way down the drainage into the Carson River. The effort did make an impact however because the BLM has not actively managed their land these plants have reared their head and are impacting local agriculture and businesses from Moundhouse to the entrance of Lahontan State Recreation Area. As a land use manager I understand it is very difficult to manage large areas however the BLM has not been very effective in treating invasive weeds nor reclaiming lands devastated by wildfire. I have offered to help the BLM in our areas if they can reimburse our costs and I know other Conservation District's or Weed Management Groups would love to have the ability to keep our crews in the field and address additional weed issues that are impacting our resources.

This letter is to delineate the Carson City Weed Coalition's concerns in working with the Bureau of Land Management Sierra Front Field Office (BLM) up to and including 2013. We have great respect for our BLM Sierra Front Field Office partner, a signatory on our Coalition's Memorandum of Under-standing (MOU) and have worked very closely with their representative, Jim DeLaureal until his retirement a few years ago.

Since Mr. DeLaureal's leaving, it has become increasingly difficult to engage the BLM representative, Dean Tonenna, on weed treatment in our wildland-urban interface areas. In fact, BLM's lack of interest in mapping and treating within that area has meant that the Coalition Coordinator (myself), has been solely tasked with the mapping of their properties along the interface, in addition to the areas of City land where I share mapping and surveying responsibilities with other MOU partners. We have tracts of BLM land, such as Silver Saddle Ranch, Prison Hill and the Ambrose Carson River Natural Area that will become the City's responsibility sometime in the near future. For the past few years, weed treatment has occurred on those properties only because of the Coalition efforts to coordinate, map and pay for it. Some years the cost has been paid by Carson City Open Space or Weed Coalition local grant funds. In 2012 the cost was paid by BLM, through the assistance of Mr. Alan Bittner, Assistant Field Manager for the Sierra Front Field Office. He was amenable to our crew doing the treatment and he paid for the crew time after the fact.

The Carson City Weed Coalition is a group of private landowners and public agency staff that work together to control and/or eradicate noxious weeds in our city.

This year I sent an e-mail to Mr. Bittner to work out 2013 treatment and learned that he was no longer in the area. Mr. Tonenna replied to me and stated that no weed treatment would be done on BLM property during 2013 because they are in the process of completing an Environmental Assessment (EA). I understand the need for EAs and applaud them for proactively working on a landscape-based plan for treatment. However, I do not believe that taking a year off from treating aggressive invasive species in the interface is in the best interest of the weed program, or in the good faith of transitional properties that will soon be Carson City's responsibility. BLM properties within Carson City jurisdiction have infes-tations of Canada thistle, bull thistle, perennial pepperweed, hoary cress and tamarisk. They are at risk for infestations of Medusahead, Scotch thistle and yellow starthistle. To my knowledge, none of their properties have been surveyed for these weed species this year.

Carson City Weed Coalition would like to have treated the existing infestations in 2013. They have been treated in varying degrees for the past few years and, as you know, treatment consistency is crucial to achieving successful long-term control. Not allowing treatment in 2013 has effectively negated the efforts of at least the last two years of treatment. We, the Coalition, are puzzled that Mr. Tonenna has not attended meetings, or sent a BLM representative, has not been forthcoming on planning or treatment options and is not responsive to e-mails and phone calls. We very much want to work with the BLM and would like to consider them an active partner, like our other MOU signatories. If you can assist us in re-establishing lines of communication and re-activating our partnership, it would be very much appreciated.

I am writing this letter to formally complain about the BLM's noxious weed control efforts in Douglas County- or more accurately, their lack thereof.

There is a significant Russian Knapweed infestation on BLM land in the Fish Springs area of the Pinenut Range. Our records indicate that from 1997 – 2007, BLM contracted with Douglas County Weed Control (DCWC) to treat this infestation. Since that time, DCWC had observed some work being done for a few years, but no efforts have been made to do any kind of control since at least 2011. The infestation is in a good sized drainage, and has been responsible for additional infestations on downstream private properties. It is difficult for DCWC to convince these private property owners to treat their infestation when the source of the problem goes untouched by the land manager. Repeated requests to the land manager to employ some measure of control, or funding to have DCWC crews perform the work have fallen on deaf ears.

I beseech you as the Noxious Weeds Coordinator to work with BLM to bring them into compliance with NRS and control their noxious weed problems in Douglas County.

It has come to the attention of Carson Water Subconservancy District (CWSD) staff that invasive weed managers in the Carson River Watershed have concerns with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) noxious weed control efforts. Douglas County Weed Control, Dayton Valley Conservation District and the Carson City Weed Coalition have voiced their concerns about the lack of weed treatment on BLM land adjacent to areas on which they are responsible for controlling invasive weeds. This results in increased difficulty for these groups to manage the spread of weeds onto their properties.

CWSD is concerned with this issue, as CWSD distributes \$75,000 for weed management to five entities in the Carson River Watershed. This funding is obtained through ad valorem taxes and is often the only funding source to combat weeds in these areas. With the lack of invasive weed treatment on BLM lands in the wildland-urban interface areas and the overall dwindling funding for treatment of invasive weeds, the work being done by groups in the Carson River Watershed is becoming less effective than it has been in the past.

As the State Noxious Weed Coordinator with the Nevada Department of Agriculture, CWSD would like your assistance in communicating these concerns with the BLM. Your help on this matter would be greatly appreciated.

- 4. Regional Water System Committee Directors Jardine, Penzel, McKenna, Erquiaga, Osborne, Fierro, and Stodieck. This committee focuses on the regional programs, recharge projects, future construction, and water quality. This committee met three times in 2013. (NOTE: This committee does not violate the six Nevada Directors quorum because Director Osborne is a non-voting member of the CWSD Board and Director Jardine is a California representative.)

On a side note, CWSD officers serve a two year term and were appointed just last year.
