Tasks of Environmental Education Coordinator

- Maintain partnerships with local schools
- Offer opportunities for increased knowledge and understanding of NPS pollution to students, their families, and the education community on a watershed basis.
- Measure gains in knowledge and document change in behavior.




CRC Education Working Group Vision
