- A Carson Water Subconservancy District project
- ☐ Funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)
- ☐ Focused on the Carson River
- Four local jurisdictions
 - Alpine County
 - Douglas County
 - Carson City
 - Lyon County





Four Local Jurisdictions – Similar But Different



- All include the same watershed
- All include the Carson River
- All participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)
- All need to regulate their floodplains

Four Local Jurisdictions – Similar But Different

- Different floodplains
- Different personalities
- Different political considerations
- Different needs
- Different opportunities
- ☐ Different ways of approaching floodplain regulation
- ☐ At different points on the road of floodplain regulation







Basic Regulatory Framework



- National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements
- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements, guidance, and programs
- Two different state model floodplain ordinances
- Four different city/county floodplain ordinances

- Carson Flood Mitigation Plan
- Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model

2016 Floodplain Ordinance Review and Improvement Project



- Precursor to the current project
- ☐ The 2016 project developed:
 - Jurisdiction specific needs and opportunities for floodplain ordinance improvements
 - Preliminary draft floodplain ordinance language to incorporate the use of the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model

2016 Needs and Opportunities Conclusions

- Need for technical and staff support to assist the jurisdictions:
 - Update and improve floodplain ordinances
 - Develop, prepare and adopt ordinances to implement identified mitigation measures
- Need for assistance with training on the new FIRMs and the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
 - For city/county staff, elected officials, planning commissioners, professionals and the public
 - For all jurisdictions





2016 Needs and Opportunities Conclusions


- ☐ Alpine County needs significant support:
 - To develop, adopt and implement a floodplain management program and ordinance
 - To develop and implement its identified mitigation measures
- Carson City, Douglas County, and Lyon County:
 - Each have differing floodplain management program strengths
 - Each have differing floodplain management program improvement opportunities
 - Each requires some support and assistance to make timely progress





2016 Needs and Opportunities Conclusions

- Need for continuing regional CWSD support to:
 - Oversee, coordinate, maintain, and manage the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
 - Maintain and update the regional Floodplain Management Plan
- Need to continue the CWSD regional coordination approach to Carson River management
 - To allow the jurisdictions to discuss, coordinate and cooperate with, and learn from each other







Current Project



Purpose

- Provide assistance to Alpine County, Carson City, Douglas County, and Lyon County
- □ Support Carson Water Subconservancy District (CWSD) and jurisdiction efforts to:
 - Accommodate the new regional floodplain mapping and flood insurance rate maps (FIRMs)
 - ☐ Implement the use of the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
 - ☐ Improve standards to exceed FEMA minimum requirements
 - Implement Carson Flood Mitigation Plan mitigation measures
 - Update and improve floodplain ordinance language
- Improve consistency among jurisdictions





Primary Project Tasks



- Review pertinent documents, guidance, and resources
- Update Jurisdiction Specific Needs and Opportunities
- Prepare Floodplain Ordinance Language, Draft and Final
- Assist with Floodplain Ordinance Adoption

Update Needs and Opportunities

- Meet with each jurisdiction's staff
 - Review the 2016 needs and opportunities assessments
 - Discuss and update needs, unique circumstances, programs, and opportunities
- Meet with CWSD staff to:
 - Review the 2016 needs and opportunities assessments
 - Discuss and update general and specific jurisdictional needs and opportunities
- Update each Needs and Opportunities Summary





Alpine County – Updated Needs and Opportunities



- The new West Fork of the Carson River FIRMs will have special flood hazard zones
- Interested in including requirements to use the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
- Interested in integrating the floodplain ordinance with the building code
- Possibly add/increase development standards along nonmapped waterways
- Possibly add provisions for dam failure inundation zones

Douglas County – Updated Needs and Opportunities

- Currently require and want to continue to require use the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
- Interested in integrating floodplain ordinance with the International Building Code
- Possible inclusion of an erosion setback along watercourses





Carson City – Updated Needs and Opportunities

- Continuing desire to make necessary changes to become a Class 4 CRS community
- Want to include requirements to use the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
- ☐ Want to change the minimum design standard for stormwater drainage to the 10-year storm
- Want to include better standards for erosion, landslides and mud flows
- ☐ Want to explore coordination of floodplain ordinance with the International Building Code





Lyon County – Updated Needs and Opportunities



- Interested in exploring participation in the CRS program
- Still want to require use the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
- Want to improve the floodplain ordinance language and consistency
- May consider increasing some standards



Updated Needs and Opportunities – Some Conclusions

- The jurisdictions want to implement requirements to use the Carson River Regional Hydraulic Model
- There is interest in exploring floodplain ordinance and building code integration
- Standards improvements vary by jurisdiction
- ☐ There is continuing support for the CWSD to lead and coordinate the regional approach to management of the Carson River





Prepare Draft and Final Floodplain Ordinance Language

- Collaborative process with the jurisdictions and CWSD
- Prepare floodplain ordinance language for each jurisdiction
- Incorporate identified items for each jurisdiction, as applicable:
 - Updated and improved language
 - Model provisions
 - Requirements
 - Needs and opportunities
 - Mitigation measures





Floodplain Ordinance Adoption

- Assist the jurisdictions with the adoption of the revised/improved floodplain ordinances
 - Planning Commission or public outreach meeting for each jurisdiction as desired
 - Presentation of the revised ordinance language at Board of Commissioners/Board of Supervisors meetings for each jurisdiction as desired





Status and Timeline

- Completing needs and opportunities updates
- Beginning ordinance language drafts
- Ordinance language drafts to be completed Fall 2018
- Ordinance adoption processes anticipated during the first half of 2019
