

## West Fork Carson River (WFCR) Vision Plan

- Being developed by Lahontan Water Board (CA)
- Advance restoration plan for meeting water quality standards
- Consistent with USEPA 2022
   Vision for the Clean Water Act section 303(d) program



## West Fork Carson River (WFCR) Vision Plan

- Not a formal regulatory action
  - Refers to existing and expected actions
  - Relies on collaboration with watershed groups (AWG, CWSD), agencies (USFS-HTNF, NRCS) and stakeholders
  - Monitoring and adaptive management
- Addresses 9 elements needed for Clean Water Act 319 funding


# Carson River Adaptive Stewardship Plan (CRASP) & WFCR Vision Plan

#### CRASP

- EPA-approved watershed plan for Nevada, not California
- Needed specifics for CA to be eligible for Clean Water Act section 319 funding

#### WFCR Vison Plan

- Companion to the CRASP
- Addresses needed specifics for CA




### WFCR Water Quality

- Significant monitoring
  - Lahontan Water Board, NDEP, STPUD, AWG
- Generally, good quality
- Protective standards
- Standards exceedances: phosphorus, nitrogen, turbidity, total dissolved solids, iron, sulfates, indicator bacteria
- Relatively low frequency, magnitude of exceedances
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) or other action required under the Clean Water Act
  - WFCR Vision Plan being developed and implemented in advance of TMDLs


#### Sources

### Actions to Improve WFCR Water Quality

- River/watershed restoration
- Erosion control
- Road/culvert improvements
- Recreation management/facilities improvements
- Grazing best management practices
- Septic tank systems improvements
- Fuels reduction
- Education and outreach
- Monitoring and information collection
- Adaptive management

#### **USEPA 9 Element Watershed Plan**

- a. Identify causes and sources of pollution
- **b.** < Estimate load reductions expected
- Describe management measures and targeted critical areas

- Develop an information and education component

## Clean Water Act Section 303(d)

#### 303(d) List

- "Impaired" waterbodies or reaches
- Updated every six years
- TMDL required

#### Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs)

- Allocate allowable pollutant loads to attain standards
- Established in the Basin Plan
- Implementation requirements for all sources
- Extensive public process



## Why was the West Fork Carson River chosen as a Vision Project?

- Robust data set
- Public and stakeholder involvement (AWG, CWSD, etc.)
- Dynamic restoration projects
- Substantial assessment and planning documents (CWSD Carson River Adaptive Stewardship Plan)
- Appropriate for TMDL alternative
  - Likely to attain standards without TMDL
- USEPA 9-Elemement Watershed Plan Clean Water Act 319 funds

## WFCR Vision Plan Development

- Identified as a Priority in 2015
- Groundwork & Outreach 2017-2020
- 4 AWG Stakeholder Forums
  - Sept 2020 Roads and Water Quality
  - Nov 2020 Restoration Projects
  - March 2021 Recreation
  - March 2022 Grazing
