Current Education Services

Education department Student services

Elementary, Middle and High school supports

- Students get behavior and crisis intervention support and education assistance from education staff during school hours and in the afterschool programs at Stewart, Carson and Dresslerville.
- Staff communicate with and meet regularly with administration and deans regarding student behavior, truancy and progress toward graduation.
- Grades and attendance is monitored using Infinite campus, a system our MOU allows us access to in the school districts.
- Truancy is emailed daily all absences of student in our program
- The department collects monthly reports on students per grade and per site
- Each staff member has been trained by the Healing center staff to be Behavior Intervention specialist through he RLEIAS program.
- The Pre-College advisor works with high school students on preparation for graduation, supporting remaining on track or in credit recovery if needed, collects data on students regarding college /post high school interested to better tailor support and set up college or tech program tours.
