

## Questions Regarding the RFQ

### North Dayton Valley Storm Drain and Basin Study

1. **Page 3 of scope of work:** The scope says that the objective of the project would be to determine if smaller or portions of projects identified in DVAMP will pass FEMA BCA. Page 4: Under “Preliminary Plan and Cost Estimate” – Plans will be developed to an approximate 60% - 90% level. Is the assumption here that, after the BCA, only portions of the flood mitigation shall be identified and 60-90% plan set shall be developed?

**Answer:** Correct. Under this project, we only want 60-90% plans for projects that have a BCA greater than one.

2. **I am assuming that the USGS LiDAR used for DVADMP shall be used for the plan production.** If the plan set is required to meet the 60% -90% level plan set, is the assumption that there would no need for additional survey? Does the County or CWSD possess dataset such as utilities that is needed for the plan set?

**Answer:** We do not anticipate any additional surveying will be needed for this study.

3. **Page 4 of the scope of work:** Under “5: Benefit-Cost Analysis” it says “ It is anticipated that CWSD staff will conduct most of this review. The hired contractor will assist with this part of the project.” Does this imply that the consultant shall prepare the Preliminary BCA report and CWSD will help review and submit it to FEMA? Please let us know your thoughts.

**Answer:** It is CWSD goal to learn the BCA process so we can assist the counties in the Carson Watershed with their projects in the future. This detail will be negotiated with the selected firm in the development of the business plan.

4. **Page 5 of the scope of work:** It says “Board Meetings – The Consultant Team will give three presentations at the end of the study to the three stakeholders. Can this be virtual or is the Consultant required to be there in person for the three board meetings to present?

**Answer:** The presentation to CWSD can be done virtually. The decision to present in person or virtually to Storey County and Lyon County Boards will be negotiated when developing the business plan.
